Constituting the Ancient City: The Political Regime and Classical Sparta (Book Manuscript in Progress)

In Ancient thought, the *politeia* or “regime” is the foundational principle of the political association: it determines not only the distribution of political offices but also the practices and education that form a common way of life for citizens. This book explores the principle of the regime as it is most fully articulated by Aristotle, as well as its most famous instantiation in Sparta. A study of the ancient regime is naturally tied an investigation of Sparta since it is the city that both ancient and modern thinkers alike identify as having legislated a way of life that wholly identified human happiness with civic activity and devotion to the common good.
